



Resolution Calling on NCGOP to Amend the State Plan of Organization to Bar Certain Convicted Felons from Serving as Officers of Any County, District or the State Party

Whereas, the North Carolina Republican Party, in its official party platform declares that the Party stands for “strong moral values”;

Whereas, the commission or guilt for a felony sex crime raises serious questions about the morals and values of any person convicted of such a crime;

Whereas, leadership positions inside the Party are positions of trust and public visibility, and Party leadership should be held to high standards of morality as part of their service;

Whereas, no person who has pled guilty, nolo contendere to, or been convicted of any felony sex crime should hold a leadership position at any level of the Party;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the NCGOP 13th Congressional District, hereby calls on the North Carolina Republican Party to amend the State Plan of Organization to add a provision placing a ban on certain convicted felons from serving as officers of any County, District or the State party, by inserting the following language in the NCGOP Plan of Organization:

“No person who has pled guilty to, entered into a plea of nolo contendere to, or been convicted of a felony sex crime, as defined by the applicable State or Federal law, shall be eligible to serve as an officer of the North Carolina Republican Party at the County, District or State level. This ineligibility shall apply regardless of whether the individual’s record has been sealed, expunged or whether the individual has received a pardon.”
